### HOW TO APPLY FOR SHORT COURSE

1. Open University of Ulster Home Page at [www.ulster.ac.uk](http://www.ulster.ac.uk)
2. Click on **How to apply** in the QUICK LINKS boxed area
3. Click on **All Other Courses**
4. Scroll to bottom of page click on **First Time User Account Creation** (or if you already have a User Id and Pin No – these must be entered here)  
This will take you to **Admissions Login** page where you need to create Login ID and Pin
5. This will take you to the screen 'Select Application Type'
6. Selection - **PG Distance Learning Programme** and press continue
7. This will take you to 'Apply for Admission'
8. Select **Academic Term 2011-2012** and complete the rest of the personal details and then click on '**Fill out application**'

Complete the various Personal Information Sections and when you arrive at Programme Selection in the Programme Choice box - use the scroll down facility and select **PG Cred Bear Module – SS DL PT** (This is short code for Post graduate credit bearing module - Social Sciences Distnace Learning Part Time)
